Tradition 1 Presentation:

Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon A.A. unity. The unity of Alcoholics Anonymous is the most cherished quality our Society has. Our lives, and the lives of all to come, depend squarely upon it. We stay whole, or A.A. dies. Without unity, the heart of A.A. would cease to beat; our world arteries would no longer carry the life-giving grace of God; His gift to us would be spent aimlessly. Back again in their caves, alcoholics would reproach us and say, "What a great thing A.A. might have been!" (12x12 Tradition 1) That's why No personal sacrifice is too great for the preservation of the Fellowship, and no one person comes before the welfare of the group.

Our brother, the noisy drunk, affords the simplest illustration of this Tradition. If he insists on disrupting the meeting, we "invite" him to leave, and we bring him back when he's in better shape to hear the message. We are putting the "common welfare" first. But it is in his welfare, too; if he's ever going to get sober, the group must go on functioning, ready for him. (The TWELVE TRADITIONS Illustrated) Each of the other Eleven Traditions explains one specific way to protect the unity of the Fellowship and the A.A. group. (The TWELVE TRADITIONS Illustrated)

To keep our fellowship united.

For on A.A. unity depend our lives,

And the lives of those to come.

Not a Glum Lot - Charles K - GSR

January 2022 "Not a Glum Lot" Group GSR Report

Our Group meets MWF, 12 Noon, at 554 Newport Avenue, Bend, OR
We held our quarterly Business Meeting last Monday, and some difficult questions were addressed as Motions.

The simplest motion, to create a Welcome chip for Visitors, took almost 45 minutes to vote upon, and finally passed.

Some more important items were allotted much less time.

For example, there was a Motion to "track members of the group."

We don't know Who says they are a member, and we voted not to find out.

I am puzzled by this reluctance to identify members.

The AA pamphlet on The AA Group says clearly that voting in business meetings should be by members of the group, only; and yet, my group does not want to know who is a member. You can see the problem.

There was a Motion to change the voting by simple Majority, to voting by 2/3 majority, and it failed. It was only a one vote margin, and, of course, it was a simple majority vote, as is our group conscience.

Finally, there was a Motion to go from quarterly business meetings to monthly business meetings. After some discussion, the final vote was 5 to 4 to keep them quarterly. So close, on several of these issues.

We appointed new meeting Secretaries, also.

It was a productive business meeting, and our group conscience, however split, was apparent nevertheless.

At the beginning, 16 people were present. Ninety-five minutes later, at the end, only 9 remained. I think it's called "attrition."

Redmond Early Risers - John T - AGSR (for Kimber J - GSR)

Hi my name is Kimber J, and I am an alcoholic. My home group is the Redmond Early Risers. We meet Monday through Friday at Zion Lutheran Church on Black Butte in Redmond. Monday

is a Big Book study, Tuesday is a step meeting, Wednesday is As Bill Sees It, Thursday is a Daily Reflection discussion and Friday is a 12 x 12 study. All new secretaries started this past week. We are meeting in person with masks and are permitted to have coffee and snacks as long as we put the mask back between sips. We are still contributing to the GSO and Intergroup 60/40 to help where there is the most need. The group also voted on the workshop poll and wanted all of them! We look forward to more group activities, online and in-person.

Attitude Adjustment - Frank W - GSR

Attitude Adjustment meets 5 days a week, Monday through Friday at 7:00AM Hybrid online and live at TEC (Trinity Episcopal Church Basement). Daily attendance is 25-35, with online and live participants being roughly equal of late. We have several regular past members who participate online from outside the area.

All meetings follow the same format of reading the Traditions, How It Works, Daily Reading, asking for visitors and newcomers to introduce themselves, chip offering, and AA related announcements. Thursday's meeting is a Big Book study but all meeting topics and most members are actively following the AA program as outlined in the Big Book, Alcoholics Anonymous. Mask are required at all times except when sipping coffee because that is both the State and Church guidelines for indoor activities.

Currently we have an active membership with 15 to 20 (regular) members participating in our monthly business meetings the first Saturday of each month, 6:45AM Hybrid at the same location. Sometimes those meetings do get a little spirited and occasionally the Group Conscious process educates old timers as well as newer members. We saw a decline in participation during the Pandemic but a resurgence is occurring.

Attitude Adjustment consistently collects more in 7th Tradition contributions than needed so we distribute all funds beyond our prudent reserve as follows:

25% to Central Oregon Intergroup

75% to GSO

In the 3rd quarter of 2021 We voted to discontinue distributing funds to District 5 because the group understood that D5 had plenty of money. If this is not correct please let us know.

Overall, we have a very healthy group that carries The Message as outlined in the Big Book, and supports both its members and the greater AA community.

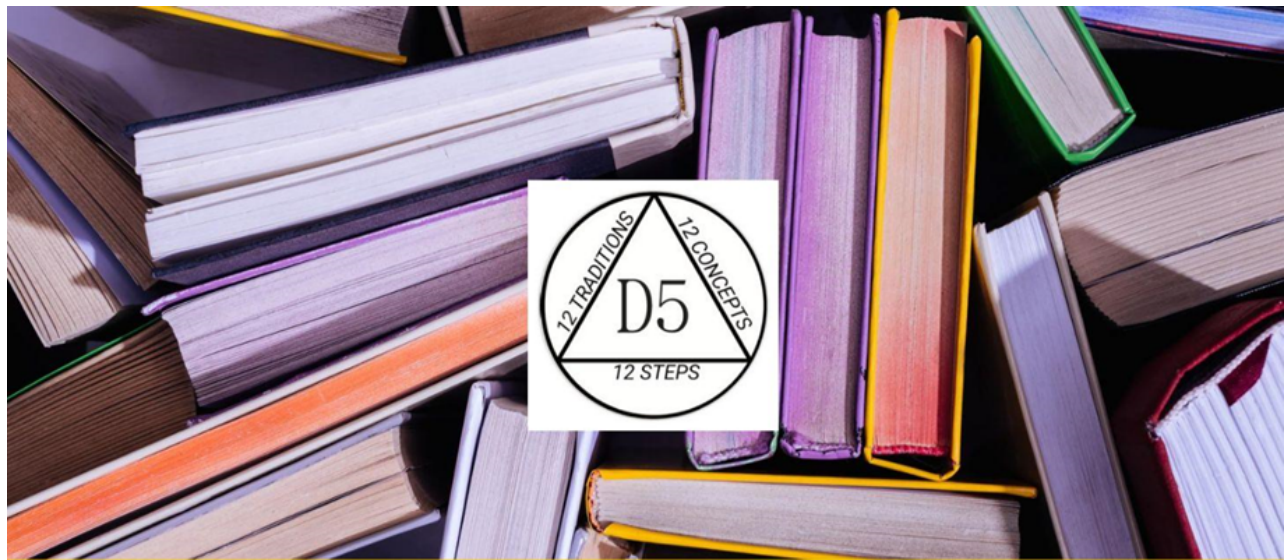
